

Keeping your personal info safe



Look out for the padlock icon when spending money online:

- Multiple browsers show how safe a website is by showing a small padlock icon next to the web address bar.
- The padlock means the website has gone through security checks to make sure it is secure.
- If there is no padlock, double check you're on the correct website as most legitimate websites will have it.

Look out for Phishing emails:

- Confirm the sender is legitimate and the email address looks real.
- Look out for words, phrases and spelling mistakes that the trusted source wouldn't use.
- If you are still unsure, contact your IT department who will be able to help further.

Use a secure network:

- Keep in mind that public wifi is not as secure as private WiFi.
- When connecting, there may be a warning that comes up to say it is not a secure connection.
- If file-sharing is enabled on your computer, it is a risk that someone can gain access to your files.
- If you need access to the internet whilst in public, the best thing to use is 4G as it is encrypted.
